VOLLEYBAL - BRAVO FIREBIRDS!

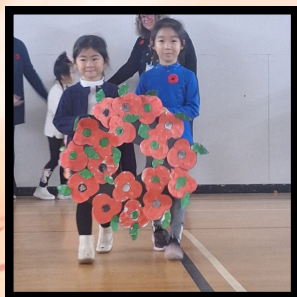

REMEMBRANCE DAY

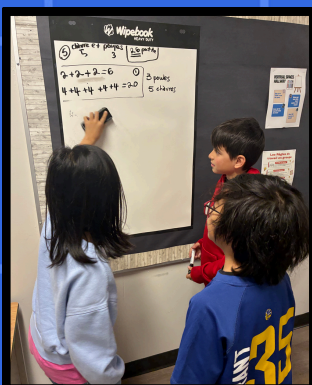
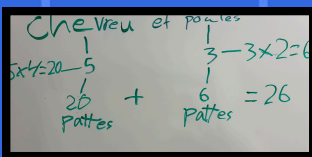
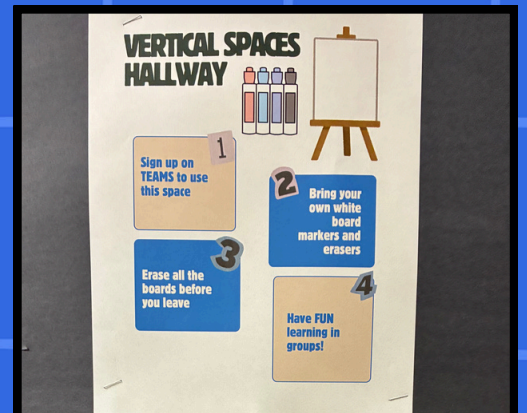
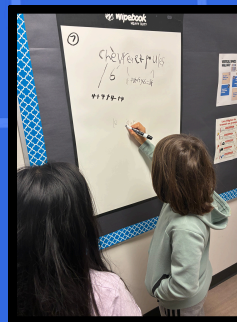
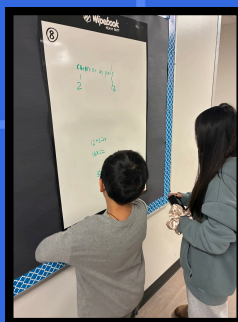
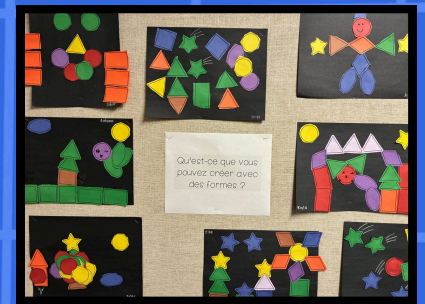
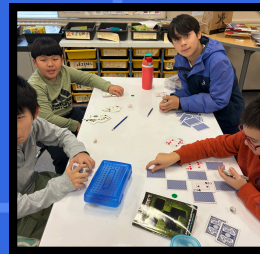
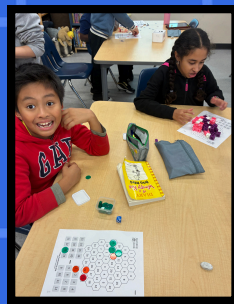
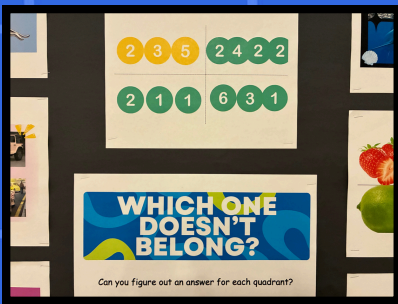

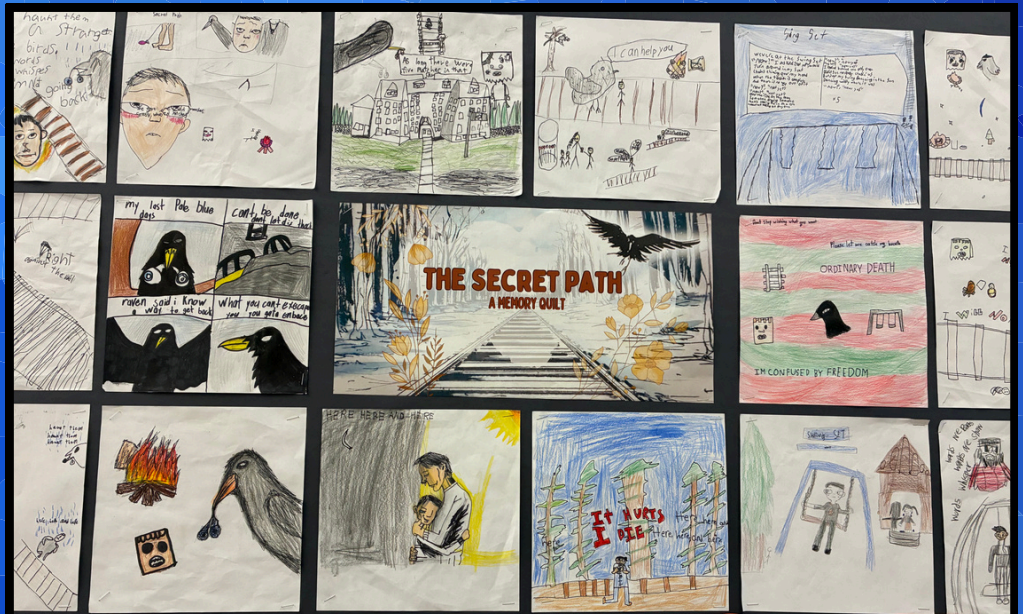
OUR SCHOOL GOAL

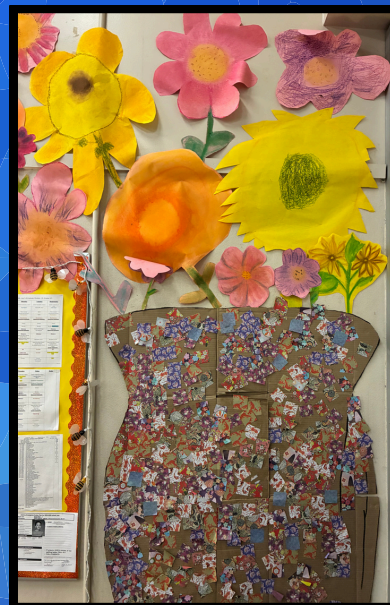


MITCHELL'S ART GALLERY
